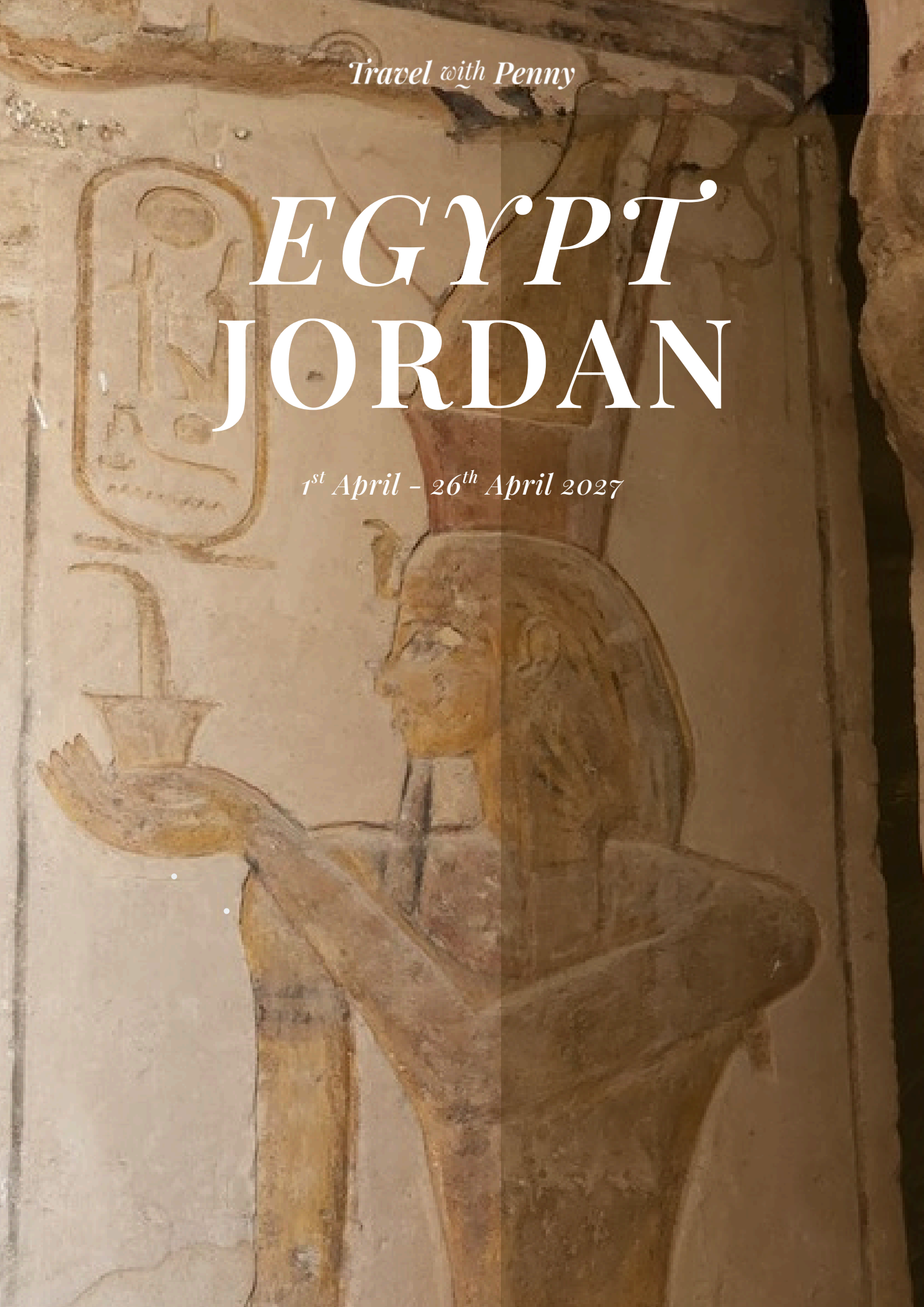

We will walk around the plateau, absorb the scale and mystery of these sacred monuments, and capture some unforgettable photos with the pyramids rising from the desert behind us.

Saqqara Plateau, one of Egypt's most important archaeological sites and an ancient royal burial ground.

This morning we journey to the Saqqara Plateau, one of Egypt's most important archaeological sites. Here we visit the remarkable Step Pyramid of King Djoser, the oldest pyramid in Egypt and the very first monumental stone structure ever built.

While exploring Saqqara we also visit the mysterious Serapeum, an underground complex carved deep into the rock. This fascinating labyrinth houses enormous granite sarcophagi believed to have held the sacred Apis bulls, animals worshipped as living manifestations of the god Ptah. Walking through these vast subterranean chambers is a truly unforgettable experience.

Optional ~ Cairo Day Tour

Today we explore some of Cairo's most historic and fascinating areas.

We begin at the Citadel of Cairo and the beautiful Mosque of Muhammad Ali, where we enjoy sweeping views across the city.

Next we visit Coptic Cairo, home to some of the oldest churches in Egypt, including the famous Hanging Church, offering a glimpse into Egypt's early Christian history.

We then travel to the remarkable Cave Church, also known as the Monastery of Saint Simon the Tanner, carved into the cliffs of the Mokattam Hills and one of the largest churches in the Middle East.

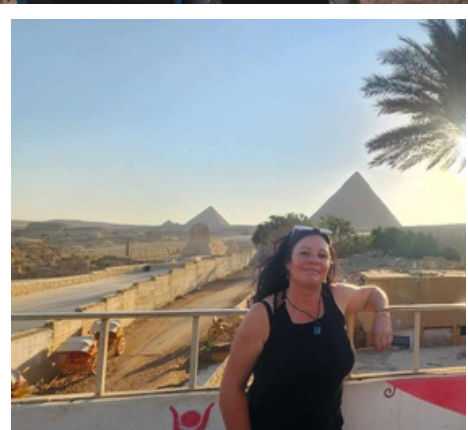
After this we visit the Museum of Egyptian Civilization, home to many important artefacts from Egypt's long history, including the famous Royal Mummies.

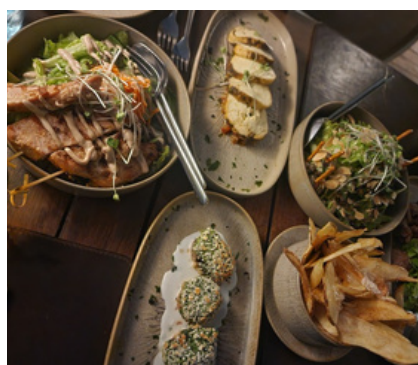
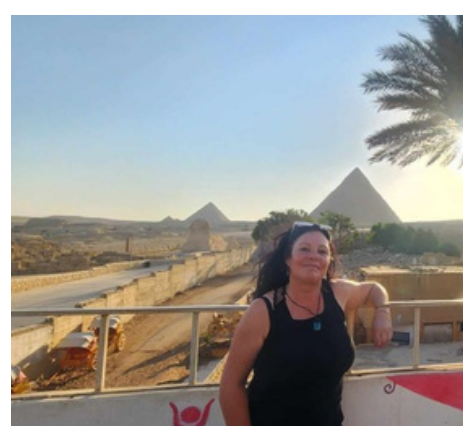
This spectacular museum has been designed to showcase over 5,000 years of Egyptian history in a modern and beautifully curated setting.

Philae Temple, Nubian Village & High Tea

Today we explore the beautiful city of Aswan, beginning with a visit to the enchanting Philae Temple. Set on its own island and reached by boat, this sacred site is dedicated to the goddess Isis and is one of the most picturesque temples in Egypt. Surrounded by calm Nile waters, Philae is known for its elegant columns, detailed carvings, and peaceful atmosphere that feels almost otherworldly.

We then continue to a traditional Nubian village, where brightly coloured homes, warm hospitality, and riverside life offer a glimpse into one of Egypt's most vibrant and welcoming cultures. Later in the afternoon, we enjoy elegant high tea at the iconic Old Cataract Hotel at 4pm, overlooking the Nile in timeless style — a perfect moment to relax and take in the beauty of Aswan. Abu Simbel

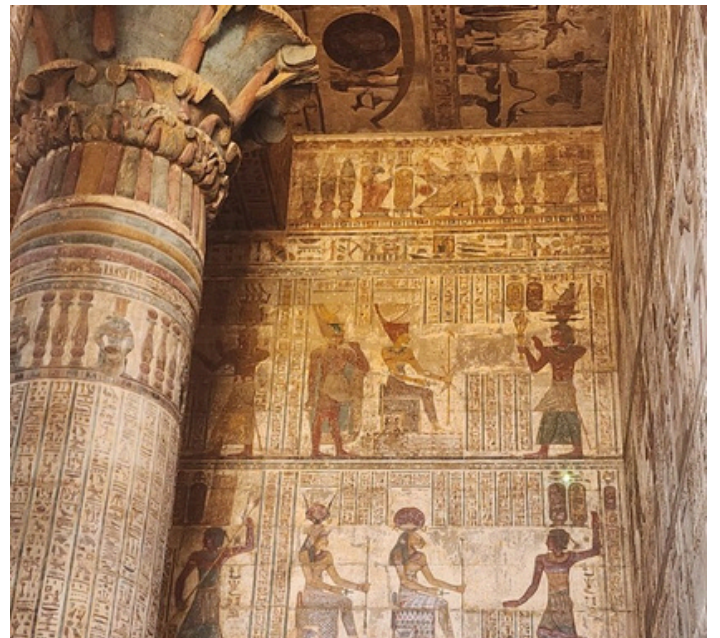
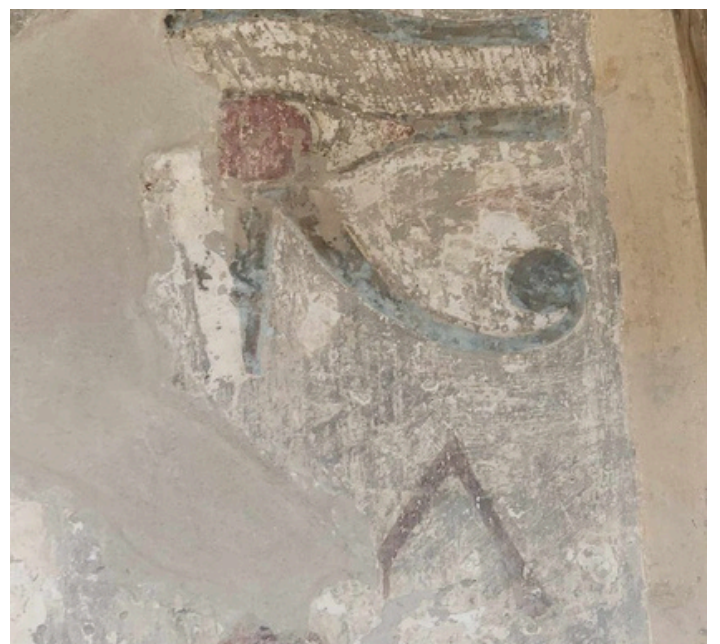
An early start this morning as we visit Abu Simbal. Located near the Egyptian border with Sudan is one of the most impressive places in Egypt, known for its two massive temples and colossal monuments carved into the rock. They were erected on the orders of Pharaoh Ramesses II in the 12th century BC to display the power of Egypt to the visitors from Nubia.

Due to the construction of the Aswan High Dam and the creation of Lake Nasser, the temples of Abu Simbel were at risk of flooding. To protect them from destruction, in 1964–1968 the temples were moved above the water surface to a place about 65 m higher than their previous location.

The Egyptian government and UNESCO funded the operation.

Sailing the Timeless Nile ~ onboard our Dahabiya

Today we board our beautiful Dahabiya, a traditional sailing boat that offers one of the most peaceful and authentic ways to experience the Nile

Unlike large cruise ships, a Dahabiya moves gently along the river, allowing us to slow down and truly absorb the timeless landscapes of rural Egypt.

Over the next three nights, we will sail between ancient temples, quiet river islands, and small villages rarely visited by larger boats.

There will be time to relax on the sun deck, watch daily life unfold along the riverbanks, and enjoy delicious freshly prepared meals on board.

Once we set sail, we'll head over to visit the unique double temple of Haroeris and Sobek in Kom Ombo.

Sailing the Nile in this way is a magical experience — calm, intimate, and deeply connected to the rhythm of the river that has sustained Egypt for thousands of years.





Sailing to Gebel el Silsila

DAY 10 — 10th April

After a delicious breakfast on board — fresh juices, eggs, and a selection of local flavours to tempt your taste buds — we begin our gentle sail along the Nile.

This morning we visit Gebel el Silsila, an ancient sandstone quarry site where temples and chapels were carved directly into the rock by pharaohs of the past.

Surrounded by dramatic cliffs on either side of the Nile, this sacred and lesser-visited site offers a unique glimpse into Egypt's ancient craftsmanship and history.

Later, we continue sailing to a peaceful island where you can enjoy a refreshing swim in the Nile or simply relax on deck, soaking in the beauty and stillness of the river as the day unfolds.

Before dinner, you are invited to join a gentle Yoga Nidra session on board, allowing you to fully unwind as the sun sets over the Nile.





Edfu & Temple of Horus

On this day we'll sail to Edfu where you'll visit the Temple of Horus, the best preserved temple in Egypt.

In the evening, dinner will be served on the riverbank under the starry skies.

After that you sit back, relax, and enjoy the breathtaking views of the Nile.



Esna, Karnak & Luxor Temples

DAY 12 — 12th April

After disembarking the boat, we stop to visit the beautifully preserved Esna Temple. Dedicated to the ram-headed god Khnum, this remarkable temple is known for its intricate carvings, towering columns, and detailed astronomical ceiling.

In the afternoon, we explore the magnificent Karnak Temple on the East Bank of the Nile. Karnak is one of the largest temple complexes ever built, a vast and awe-inspiring site developed over thousands of years by generations of pharaohs. Wander through its towering columns, giant statues, and grand halls as you step into the heart of ancient Egypt.

Later, we visit Luxor Temple, beautifully set along the Nile and especially magical in the late afternoon light. Built by Amenhotep III and Ramses II, the temple is known for its impressive statues, ancient hieroglyphs, and remarkable avenue of sphinxes that once connected it to Karnak Temple.

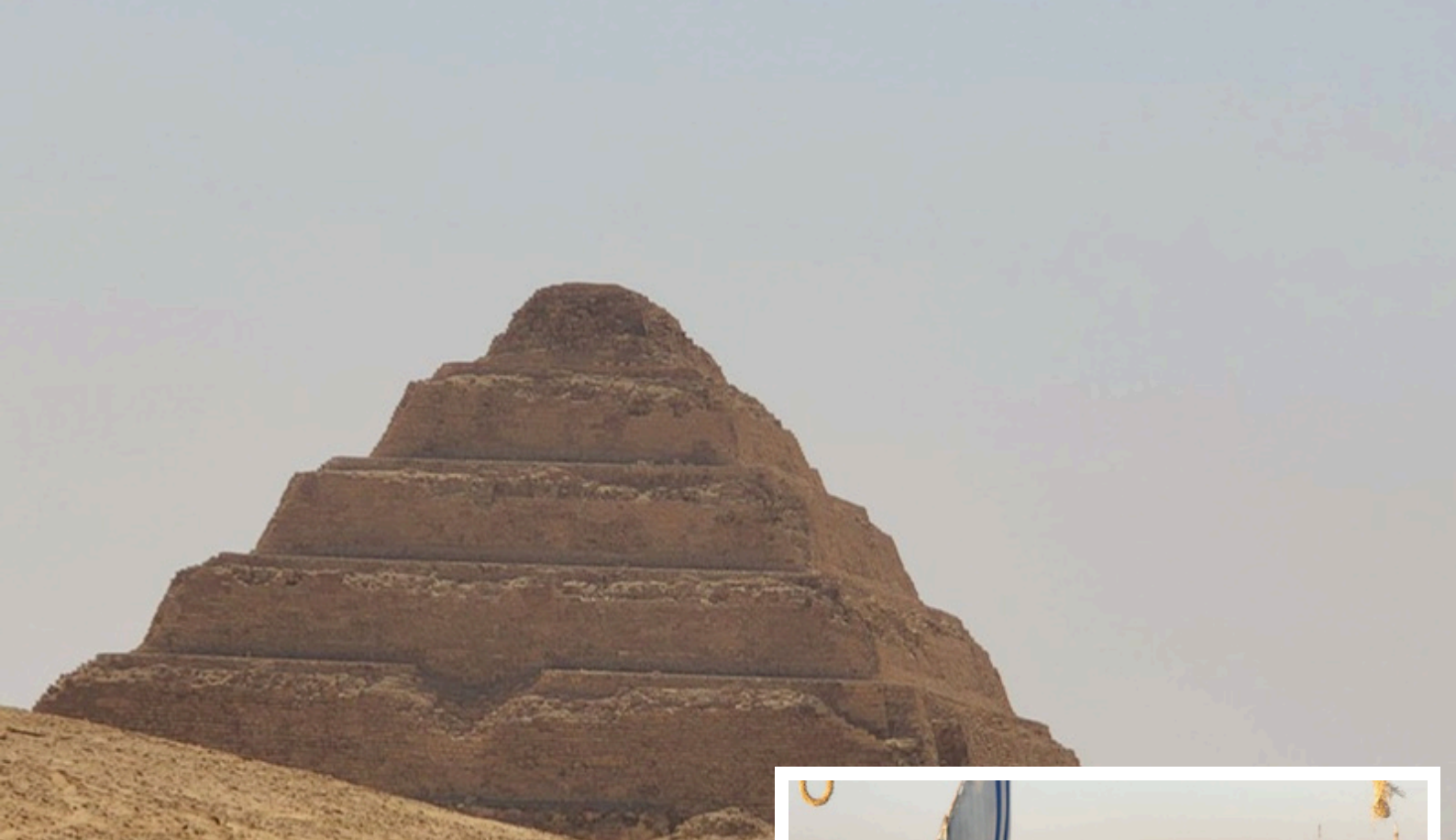
Explore the ancient tombs, temples, and stories that have shaped Egypt's extraordinary history. We stay at Embrace Hotel or similar.

Later, we join friends for a peaceful felucca sail on the Nile, drifting toward a beautiful sandy island as the light softens across the water.

Surrounded by the stillness of the Nile and desert landscapes, we unwind with gentle yoga, sound healing, and a deeply relaxing yoga nidra practice beneath the evening sky. Stay Embrace Hotel Luxor or similar.

Into the Sinai ~ Journey to Dahab

DAY 15 — 15th April

This morning we take a short flight to Cairo before continuing on to Sharm el Sheikh later in the day, where we will be met at the airport.

From here, we journey through the stunning Sinai desert mountains to the laid-back seaside town of Dahab, whose name means “Gold.”

Along the drive, take in the breathtaking contrast of the Sinai Peninsula, where reddish-pink desert mountains meet the brilliant turquoise waters of the Red Sea. The landscape is raw, peaceful, and unlike anywhere else in Egypt.

Dahab is a relaxed coastal town known for its bohemian atmosphere, beautiful waterfront, and vibrant café culture. Restaurants and small cafés line the shore, with outdoor seating perfectly positioned to soak in the ocean views stretching across to the mountains of Saudi Arabia.

We also visit a traditional Bedouin village, where we are welcomed into a way of life shaped by the desert, simplicity, and deep connection to the land.

In the evening, we enjoy a traditional Bedouin-style dinner in the desert under the stars before returning to Dahab later that evening, carrying the stillness and magic of the day with us.

After watching the sunrise, we hike down Mt Sinai and spend some time at St Catherines Monastery. Arrive back in Dahab around lunch time. Tonight we enjoy a beach night with a lamb meal and other yummy food, we will share laughter and music. Enjoy our last night in Egypt.

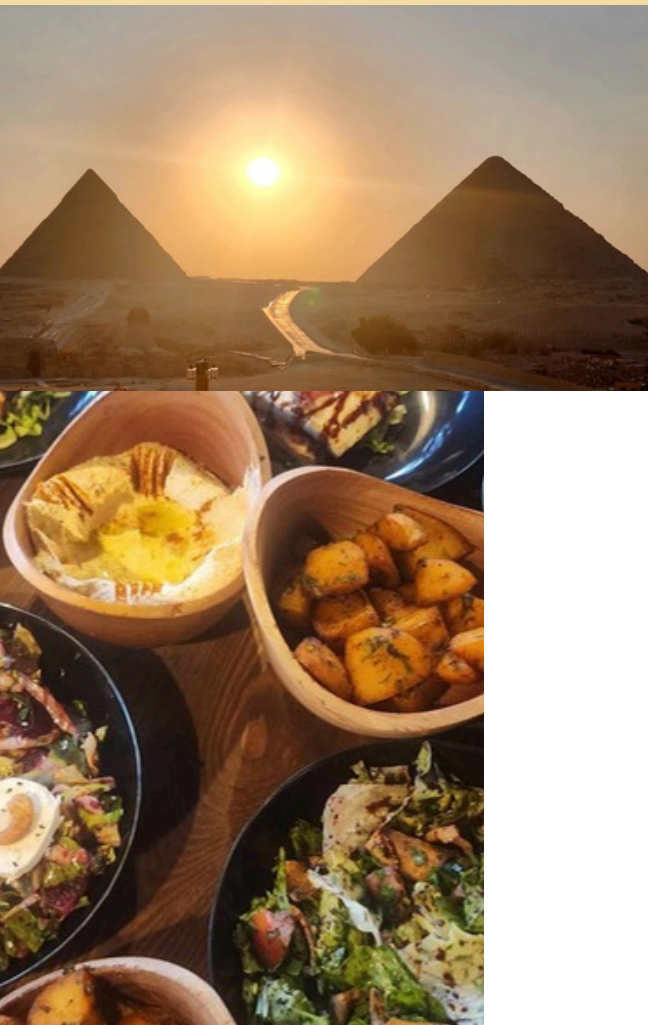

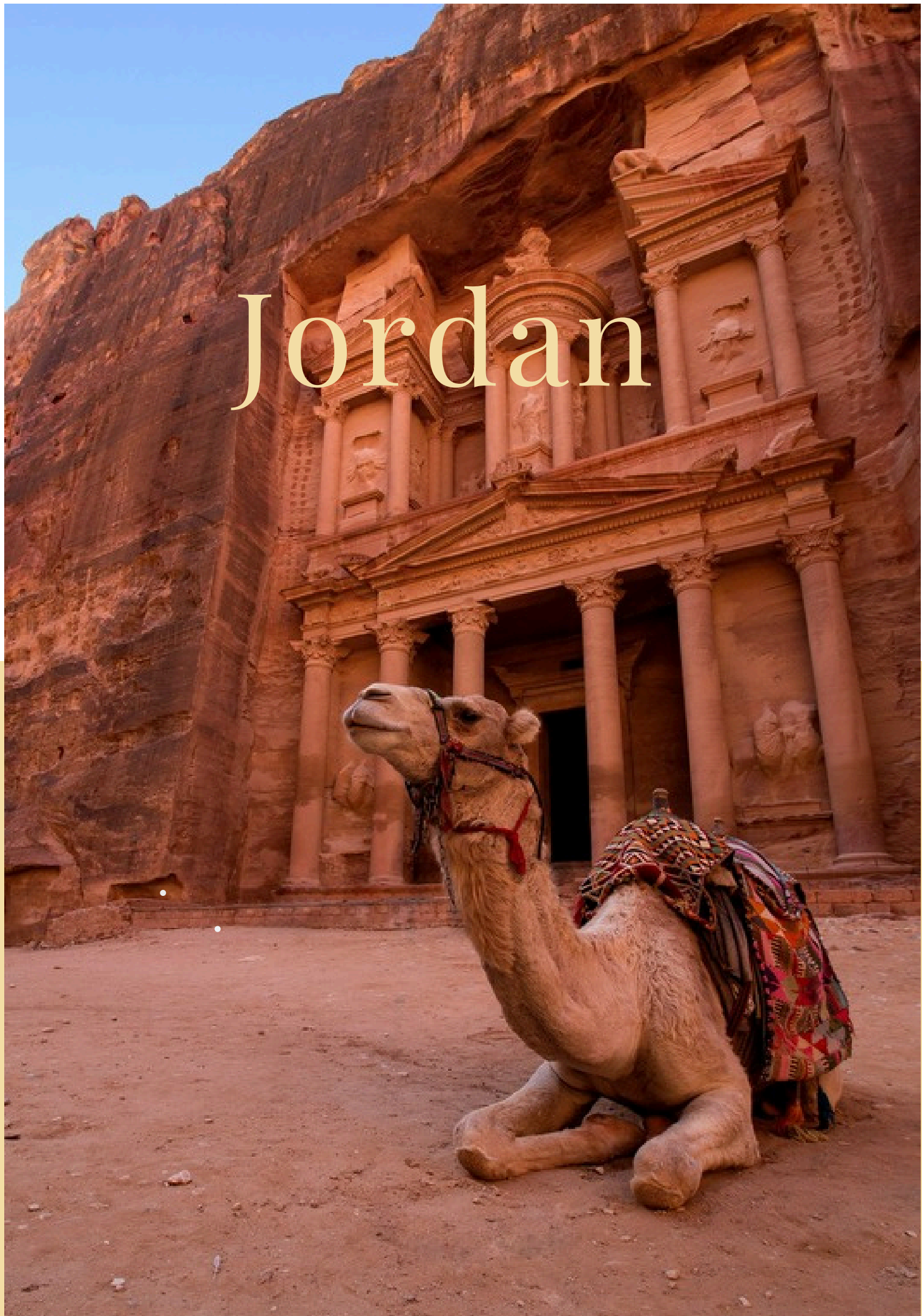

DAY 21 — 21st April

We catch a ferry from Taba to Aqaba in Jordan. Meet and assist upon arrival to Aqaba Port. Transfer to Wadi Rum, the legendary “Valley of the Moon,” where immense sandstone mountains rise from sweeping desert plains. Enjoy lunch at a Bedouin camp, savoring traditional flavors. In the afternoon, embark on a 3-hour 4x4 sunset ride across dramatic landscapes, weaving through canyons and dunes that inspired Lawrence of Arabia. Return to the camp for a Bedouin dinner and overnight beneath a canopy of stars.

After breakfast, transfer to Petra, the UNESCO-listed “Rose City” carved into red sandstone cliffs.

Begin your discovery with the Siq, a narrow gorge leading to the breathtaking Treasury, then continue to the Royal Tombs and Roman Theater.

For lunch, enjoy a warm cultural exchange with a local Jordanian family, sharing homemade dishes and stories that bring the heritage of Petra to life.

In the evening, return to your hotel for dinner and overnight.

After breakfast, dedicate a second day to Petra’s hidden wonders.

Hike up to the Monastery, a monumental structure perched high above the valley, and explore the High Place of Sacrifice with its sweeping views.

Later, join a cooking class at Petra Kitchen, preparing authentic Jordanian recipes and enjoying them for lunch. Return to your hotel for a relaxing evening, dinner, and overnight.

In the afternoon, drive east to explore the Desert Castles:

- Qasr Amra—a UNESCO World Heritage Site with vivid frescoes depicting daily life.
- Qasr Al-Azraq— a black basalt fortress famously used by Lawrence of Arabia.
- Qasr Al-Kharanah— a mysterious desert palace with striking symmetry.
